

## ONGOING DEVELOPMENT PROJECTS IN INDONESIA SUPPORTED BY THE STATE SECRETARIAT FOR ECONOMIC AFFAIRS (SECO)

For the period of 2021 – 2024, Switzerland’s main objective is to support Indonesia overcome its remaining development challenges and become more competitive, resilient, equitable and resource efficient, and thereby a reliable political and economic partner for Switzerland. Therefore, the new programmes focus on the following two priorities:

- 1) Fostering effective public institutions, particularly in urban areas, through efficient use of resources
- 2) Strengthening private sector competitiveness, in particular small and medium-sized enterprises (SME)
